


WECC Website Release Notes 1.0

WECC has implemented several enhancements to the WECC Website. Highlights of recent website improvements are described in this document. WECC would like to thank its stakeholders for their suggestions and support. These enhancements help simplify the way in which users locate documents and information on the site. Requirements

Preferred browsers for the WECC Website are: IE9+, Firefox 18+, Chrome 24+, and Safari 6+. Other browsers may work, but offer a degraded experience.

Additions

- WECC website account holders can now set up “Alerts” to know when content has been added to or modified on the website. For more information on how to set up Alerts, refer to the “[How to Set up Alerts](#)” document posted on the website.
- New calendar icon added to access past and future committee meetings.
- Created a [WECC Website Usage Tips](#) Web page so users can learn useful tips and tricks about exploring the website.
- Added  Lock icon to identify non-public documents as set forth in the WECC Information Sharing Policy. Users must be an account holder with granted non-disclosure agreement (NDA) permissions via an executed NDA to view these documents.
- Added several new features to the document table Web parts. These are the document tables on WECC’s Web pages that display specific search results.

New features include:

- Sorting – Click on the column headings to sort documents in ascending or descending order.
- Paging – Click on the page numbers at the bottom of the document Web part to page forward and back through multiple pages.
- Tool Tips – Hover over ‘results’ in the bottom-right corner of the Web part to see the search criteria.



- Preview Panel – Preview a file without actually opening it, hover over the ellipsis (...) next to the document title. From the preview panel you can page through the file, see basic document properties, download a copy and open the file.
- Added smart search results to the “404 Page Not Found” Web page. Click [here](#) for an example.
- Created [Website Availability Reference Sheet](#) that defines the website records statement for documents posted on the website. Website documents are also known as convenient copies. This reference sheet only applies to the documents posted on the website. This document does not apply to the master files maintained at WECC internally.
- Added ⚡ 101 icon to quickly access basic knowledge about the subject.

Changes

- Reduced time allotted for document indexing from hours to minutes. Now it only takes a few minutes for new documents to appear on the website.
- The WECC Usage Tip displayed in the Web page footer now displays a new tip each month.
- Removed the five most recent document table Web parts from the Committees Web pages.

Available for Implementation

There are other features available for implementation on the WECC Website webpages. Users are encouraged to work with [WECC Support](#) or the Staff Liaisons to submit an enhancement request. Listed below are some of the features now available for implementation:

- Accordion to any Web page to help group together similar information and documents. Accordions are the expandable gray headings on the Web pages.
- Different document table Web part template to organize similar documents and their document properties to help find documents and high-level information about the document.

The new templates available include these columns:

- Type, Title, Document Date
- Type, Title, Effective Date, Inactive Date
- Type, Title, Effective Date
- Type, Filename, Title, Effective Date

- Individual Search box to document table Web parts that contain more than 20 documents.
